Go ahead... take a look at the dollar I sent you (it's real).

I sent it because I needed to get your attention.

And because I wanted to put something real in your hands that proves what we're all experiencing.

**My name is George Harris – a proud Republican - and I'm running for Nevada State Senate in District 8.**

And I'm running for one simple reason:

Because life in Nevada has gotten too damn expensive...

And much of the reason comes straight from decisions made in Carson City.

You don't need a politician to explain what's happening.

*You're already living it.*

Every time you check out at the grocery store.

Every time you fill up your gas tank.

Every time the rent goes up...again.

Think about this for a second...

Not long ago, a dollar could actually get you something.

- A burger off the value menu
- A slice of pizza

- A box of mac and cheese

Even the Dollar Store actually sold things for a dollar.

Now?

That same dollar barely gets you *anything*.

What used to feel manageable now feels tight.

What used to feel tight...now feels overwhelming.

And here's the part that should bother you:

That means:

- Making decisions based on how they affect people in the real world - not political talking points
- Taking responsibility instead of passing the blame
- Focusing on lowering everyday costs, not making life more complicated or expensive

Here's one simple example...

Right now, the cost to register your car depends on how much your car is worth.

So the more responsible you are...the more you pay. That doesn't make sense.

I believe it should be simple and fair:

**A flat \$60 registration fee.**

No surprises. No penalty for owning a reliable vehicle.

Just common sense.

I'm not promising perfection. But I will promise you this:

Every decision I make will come down to one question:

**Does this make life more affordable - or more  
expensive - for the people I represent?**

Because that's what adult supervision looks like.

And right now...it's missing.

Now I'm going to ask you to do something important.

That dollar I sent you?

I used it to make sure this message reached you.

And I did it for a reason.

Because when you see it between now and Election Day...

I want you to remember exactly what this campaign is about.

Your money. Your cost of living.

And whether the people in charge are finally going to take responsibility.

**I'm George Harris - and I'm asking for your vote.**

And if you're willing, I'm also asking for a small donation.
