As I walk neighborhoods across District 8, one question comes up all the time: *What does a State Senator actually do?*

Truth is, it's not much different from when I was a CEO running day-to-day operations of my company. You make decisions, you set direction, and you're accountable to the people you serve.

From my perspective, it's simple—my job is to protect you and make sure government works for you, not the other way around. A State Senator I'll help shape the policies that impact your everyday life: public safety, our schools, taxes, and make sure the runway for businesses is free of obstacles from bureaucrats so we can drive our economy and create jobs.

Terriers, Shih Tzus, and Chihuahuas make up more than 20% of our shelter population. Why? Because they're small, they're cute, and people rush to buy or adopt them.

But a few months later, the excitement wears off.

And here's the ugly truth—some get returned to shelters... and some get dumped on the street. Left at a stop sign. Left to fend for themselves.



That's not just sad—it's a serious problem. And it's been going on far too long.

Now add this: we've got a growing puppy mill problem.

In 2025 alone, the City of Las Vegas issued 56 citations to illegal, unlicensed backyard breeders and rescued 28 puppies. Just this month—April—authorities investigated so-called “training facilities” and removed 30 more dogs.

That's not a small issue. That's a system failing animals who can't protect themselves.

Let me be crystal clear—I won't tolerate anyone hurting animals. Dogs, cats, any animal.

If you abuse them, you've got a problem with me. And when I'm in the State Senate, you're going to face real consequences.

We're going to review every law on the books. Strengthen penalties where needed. And audit our shelters to make sure animals are treated with care, safety, and respect.

Because how we treat animals says everything about who we are.

And right now—we can do better.

Our pets aren't just animals. They're family. They sit with us when we're sick. They protect our homes. They love us without conditions.

Right here in Nevada—we still have:

- Puppy mills that treat dogs like products
- People who abuse and neglect animals behind closed doors
- Underground dog fights where cruelty is the whole point

That's not just wrong... it's evil.

And here's the truth most politicians won't say out loud:

If someone can hurt a defenseless animal, they're capable of hurting people too.



When I get to Carson City, I'm going to push for real consequences—not slaps on the wrist.

I'm talking about:

- **Massive fines** that actually shut down puppy mills for good
- **Felony charges** for serious animal abuse
- **Mandatory jail time** for anyone involved in dog fighting
- **Lifetime bans** on owning animals for repeat offenders

No loopholes. No excuses. No second chances for people who enjoy cruelty.

Shut Down Puppy Mills—for Good

Puppy mills are one of the worst offenders.

Dogs & Cats are kept in cages, bred over and over, living in filth, never seeing sunlight. It's a factory system built on suffering.

We need:

- Strict licensing and surprise inspections
- Real enforcement—not just paperwork
- Immediate shutdowns for violations

If you run a puppy mill, your business should be over. Period.

Zero Tolerance for Dog Fighting

Dog fighting is barbaric. It's not a "sport." It's torture.

Anyone involved—organizers, bettors, spectators—should face serious jail time.

Because if you're standing around cheering while animals tear each other apart...

You don't belong in a civilized society.

Here's the bottom line:

Animals don't have a voice.

We do.



And it's our responsibility to protect them.

This isn't a Republican or Democrat issue. It's a human issue. It's about basic decency.

My Promise

As your State Senator, I will fight for:

- Stronger laws
- Tougher penalties
- Real enforcement

Because in a civilized society, we protect the innocent.
